### April History Question:

Willard E. Winner's Merylwood Estates development project did not go as planned, so the Oakland property began to be subdivided. Who purchased Oakland and 200 acres... and for what purpose? (Not Lakewood Cemetery yet)

<u>Answer</u>: John Mayor, a Kansas City coal operator, purchased Oakland in order to make a second attempt at subdividing. However, actual development was delayed, and then a local neighbor informed Mayor that both time and vandals were taking a significant toll on the property. Mayor's coal company leased the house and 200 acres to the Metz family to occupy and repair in lieu of paying rent. Beecher Metz was a lad of 13 years when he came to Oakland. He later gave us detailed descriptions of buildings, glass in the foyer doors, pear and apple orchards, bridle paths, plantings and Mirror Lake. He was enchanted with forsythias, syringas, flowering quince and Russian violets, and would later become a landscape architect. Metz and his family lived in the Benoist mansion on the Oakland grounds until 1919. A year later, in 1920, Lakewood Park Cemetery was established.

### History Question for July:
