Kate Chopin featured at Ladies' Tea

On September 29th, the *Ladies of Oakland* hosted their *Annual Afternoon Tea*, featuring the usual dainty delicacies as well as a very special guest. Donned in period finery, living history performer *Linda Spall* expertly portrayed Victorian author *Kate Chopin*. During Spall's fascinating program, attendees learned about Kate's controversial book, *The Awakening*, as well as her connections to Saint Louis, Oakland House and the Benoist family. We at Oakland never tire of the story of the young *Kate O'Flaherty* who met and courted her future husband *Oscar Chopin*, nephew of *Louis A*. *Benoist*, right within the walls of our beloved mansion.

To make the event even more of a treat, we were thrilled to welcome as special guests two of Kate's great-granddaughters, *Suzie Chopin* and *Barbara (Chopin) Lucks.* Suzie shared one fact that she finds fitting: if you stand by the grave of Oscar's Uncle Louis, and look a bit to the right, you'll be able to spot Kate's final resting place among the Benoist descendents in Calvary Cemetery.

The event realized an overall profit of \$1,230.00, which included a \$70 donation from Suzie Chopin - thank you! Six lucky winners took home the centerpieces which were created from tea pots donated by *Nancy Harmon* filled with flowers arranged and donated by *Rosie Miller* - thanks so much, ladies. This much-anticipated event would not have been possible

Last Open Luncheon of the Year


Thursday, November 3, 2022






